Track A	Yes – by the state through the regulator at the university.	N/A	State regulator pays with track reimbursing the expenses.	None – all paid by track through reimbursement.
Track B	Not currently	Commission is responsible for necropsy costs but does not have the funding needed to do them. A recently changed piece of law has allowed certain monies to be dedicated to covering necropsy costs, and it is expected they will start doing necropsies in the not-too-distant future.	State Racing Commission	None. By law, the Commission is responsible.
Track C	Yes – Necropsy is normally ordered by the State Racing Commission. The nearby Animal Diagnostic Laboratory System performs all necropsies.	N/A	Track	N/A
Track D	Yes – the Regulator	N/A	Regulator (funded by Track/Horsemen)	N/A
Track E	Yes – the Animal Health Diagnostic Center lab at the state university performs the necropsies.	N/A	Track	State-mandated that track pays.
Track F	No – State Vet performs necropsies when needed.	State Vet requests a necropsy if he suspects suspicious activity.	Horse trainer	N/A
Track G	Yes, every horse that is put down is sent for necropsy. The Animal Health Center performs all necropsies.	N/A	Cost is covered by the Gaming Policy Enforcement Branch, and the track and the HBPA split 50/50 the cost of transporting the horses to the lab.	The payments are the same regardless of the circumstances.
Track H	No	At the discretion of the Racing Commission	State Racing Commission	Commission has control of the process.

Track I	Yes – State Racing Commission	N/A	State Racing Commission - However, if the horse was insured and the insurance company wants a copy of the necropsy, the Commission requires the insurance company to pay for the cost of the necropsy before they allow them to have a copy of the report.
