Racetrack A	X		It should be common knowledge that the split is dictated by statute.	Track splits uncashed tickets with the horsemen's organizations at the track. This is dictated by statute.
Racetrack B		X		The state statutes allow the racetrack to retain the uncashed tickets with no percentage dedicated to purses.
Racetrack C		X		Expired mutuel tickets must be turned over to the state as required by legislation.
Racetrack D		X		Uncashed tickets over 1 year old go to the state.

Racetrack F		X		The track does not share the revenue.
Racetrack G		X		Track does not share the revenue with the horsemen.
Racetrack H		X		Technically, uncashed tickets never expire although they are purged from the tote system annually.
Racetrack I		X		100% of the revenue goes to the state.

Racetrack K	X		No	Per state regulations, unclaimed ticket monies are split equally between horsemen (in the form of purses) and the association (as commissions) by state regulation.
Racetrack L		X		All uncashed ticket money goes to the state.
Racetrack M		X		Track remits uncashed winning tickets to the state.
Racetrack N		X		Uncashed money goes to the track but is a trade off with the Racing Commission to pay for drug testing.
